Voting at Designated Polling Place

- <u>Find your polling place online</u>. The International Accessibility Icon indicates it meets accessibility requirements.
- All polling locations in Pennsylvania must have at least one accessible voting booth, yet these may not be fully accessible to every voter. Most voters will vote using a hand-marked paper ballot. Some voters will use a digital machine if they are unable to mark a paper ballot. Learn more about these options on <u>this votespa.com page</u>.
- If you need assistance voting, pollworkers may assist. You can also state that you need assistance voting when you register to vote.

Voting by Absentee Ballot

A person with an illness or physical disability who is unable to go to the polling place or to operate a voting machine may vote by absentee ballot. For full list of eligibility requirements, go to <u>votespa.com</u>

- <u>Application for absentee ballot</u> can be submitted online or by mail. It must be received in the county board of election's office by 5 p.m. on October 27.

Voting by Mail-in Ballot

A person who is not eligible for an absentee ballot may request a mail-in ballot.

- <u>Application for absentee ballot</u> can be submitted online or by mail. Applications must be received by the county election office by 5 p.m. on October 27.

Voting by Alternative Ballot

If you have a disability or are 65 and older and your polling place is inaccessible, voting with an alternative ballot by mail is an option. <u>Information on alternative ballots is online.</u>
